Make a Splash in the Wildwoods, NJ

The Wildwoods, NJ – When it comes to making a splash, the Wildwoods have so much to offer – from miles of ocean waves to wade, swim, surf, and boogie-board; to waterslides, lazy river tube floats, raft rides, heart-racing jet skis, and power boats; to, relaxing, private hotel/motel swimming pools.

Cool Ocean Fun

Five miles of Atlantic Ocean surround the Wildwoods, fronted by spacious and beautiful, FREE white-sand beaches with plenty of room to spread out. They are the perfect spot for making a splash in the summer sun whether you're surfing, boogie boarding, power boating, jet skiing, sailing, or kayaking.

Wet and Wild Waterparks

Along with award-winning beaches, there are three beachfront waterparks to experience. Morey's Piers offers two large beachfront waterparks: Raging Waters, located at the end of Mariner's Pier for cool relief on a hot summer day, with plunging waterfalls, cool cabanas, spas, hydro chutes, speed slides, raft rides, tube floats, lazy rivers, waterslides, rope swings, and water guns for soaking; and Ocean Oasis, located at the end of Surfside Pier, offering Shotgun Falls and over half a dozen other waterslides, lazy rivers, an interactive activity pool, cabanas, Waterlilies Swim Up Bar, and Stubborn Brothers Beach Bar & Grille. Splash Zone, located at Schellenger Avenue and the Boardwalk, offers all-day wet and wild fun, with slides galore for excitement and their iconic 1,000-gallon dumping bucket. It also features the island's only Flow Rider surfing attraction, plus relaxing cabanas and an outdoor bar.

Seaport Pier, located at 22nd Street and the Boardwalk in North Wildwood, features restaurants, bars, a swim club, and small outdoor concert venue area. This multi-purpose venue with resort-style amenities for regional and tourist guests provides year-round entertainment and activities for visitors of all ages. Fishing and Crabbing

The seas surrounding the Wildwoods are ripe with flounder, weakfish, tautog, bluefish, and striped bass. Not only do the commercial fishermen know the value of the area, but those who fish for fun are aware of the ocean's plentiful bounty, too. Throughout the warmer months of the year, visitors and locals alike enjoy taking the entire family out for a day of boating and fishing. The bayside of the island is filled with boat slips and marinas where boat owners keep their vessels, as well as where charter and party boat operators dock their boats and are available for rentals.

Charter and party boat captains in the Wildwoods offer excursions, ranging from night fishing trips for bluefish or drum-fish; full-day excursions in search of tuna, marlin, and swordfish; or a Mississippi River-style paddleboat journey for those who prefer to take in the serene sights rather than catching "the big one." Whether it's a parent-and-child, a friend's day out, or a full family event, fishing in the Wildwoods' waters will grant you some of the largest catches off the coast and back bays along the Jersey Shore.

Fishing boats typically offer four, six or eight-hour trips. Those who find themselves in need of fishing equipment are gladly outfitted with the necessary rigs and bait on all the charters.

In addition to fishing charters, there are several sightseeing boats in the Wildwoods, each with a captain well-versed in the local marine environment and all with a near-perfect record for finding schools of bottle-nosed dolphins and often whales that make the local waters their home in the summer.

Another maritime activity favored by those in the Wildwoods is crabbing, done in the marshy areas and back bays of the island. Crabbing is a fun, low-cost activity the entire family can enjoy from area bulkheads, fishing piers or from a boat using nets, cages, or hand lines. There are bait and tackle shops throughout the Wildwoods where the personnel will help even the most inexperienced crabbers choose bait and equipment and provide suggestions and tips for bringing in a good catch that can feed an entire family a fresh blue claw crab dinner.

Fast and Fun Watercraft Activities

For thrill-seekers, the Wildwoods offer high-speed water excursions onboard large multi-passenger speedboats that race along the shores, giving passengers an exhilarating and often refreshing glimpse of the island and its environs from the ocean.

For the more independent thrill-seekers, personal watercraft vehicles (wave runners) can be rented by the hour or day along the beach and bay. Windsurfing is another popular activity for water lovers, especially in Wildwood Crest's vast Sunset Lake, which has ample space and wind without the wake of the ocean. Parasailing along the coastline is yet another option offering an unmatched maritime experience.

Whether you opt for a full day of fishing, a sightseeing dinner cruise or a few hours zipping over the waves, don't miss the opportunity to splash around in the Wildwoods, surrounded by the bounty and beauty of the sea.
