GREG COLYER

Greg "Wired" Colyer, a native Californian and Army veteran who spent 27 years as an Air Traffic Controller in the Bay Area, will pilot the Ace Maker T-33 Shooting Star at this year's Wildwoods Thunder Over the Waves Airshow. When he's not flying airshows, Greg teaches at either Edwards AFB or at NAS Patuxent River in the respective service's Test Pilots School, or flying corporate aircraft.

Air Force veteran and author Jerry Conley of Vampire Airshows will fly his DeHavilland Vampire, which was the world's first single-engine jet fighter. Jerry's 42-plus years of flying experience includes time in aircraft such as the Beechcraft Bonanza, Cessna 172, Citabria, Super Decathlon, SAI Marchetti, Bell Helicopters, HA-200 Casa Jet, DeHavilland DH-115 Vampire, DeHavilland DH-112 Swiss Venom, L-39 Albatross, AVL-29 and the BAC Strikemaster. He has flown high-performance jet aircraft at airshows across the country for more than 15 years. Jerry holds a Surface Level Aerobatic card with Solo Jet certification and dogfight.

Randy's passion for flying began at a young age, when he'd fly with both his father and one of his heroes, his Great Uncle Gilbert Ball—who flew 51 missions over Europe in the B-17 Flying Fortress. Now a pilot for more than 39 years and a current airline captain, Randy is a key figure in airshow history. With over 20,000 total flying hours and more than 2,000 hours in Russian jet fighters, he's also an experienced test pilot who has performed in both military and civilian airshows from Canada to Mexico. He's known for his MiG-17 demonstrations, pulling up to 8 Gs and reaching speeds near 700 mph.

GOLDEN KNIGHTS

The United States Army Parachute Team, nicknamed the Golden Knights, is the U.S. Army's official demonstration- and competition-parachute team. It consists of parachutists from all Army branches and is divided into two subteams. The Golden Knights travel the U.S. (and occasionally overseas) to perform for public audiences—ranging from small civic events to major events like NASCAR races, NFL games and large international airshows. Each 12-member team travels approximately 240 days per year, using its Bombardier C-147A jump aircraft as its primary mode of transportation.
